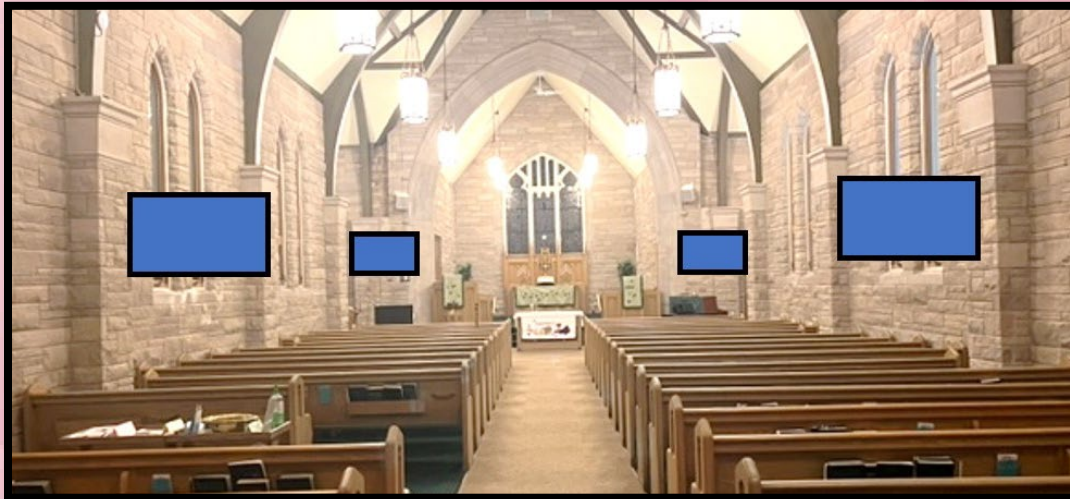


## Sanctuary Media Project

Thanks to a special gift given to the church, we are moving forward on a project that has been discussed here since the days that cellphones were the size of bricks and using the internet tied up the phelines. Utilizing only this special memorial (designated for updating our sanctuary media) and another undesignated memorial gift, we will be installing TVs in the sanctuary so that everyone worshipping in-person can enjoy the PowerPoint slides.

The following image is a rendering of what the set-up will look like:



In addition to the TVs, we will also be updating our live-streaming capabilities. Instead of using an iPhone pointing at a TV, we will have a computer-operated camera. This camera-and-computer set up will allow us to insert our PowerPoint directly into the live-stream, making the slides easier to read for those worshipping online. This camera can “Pan, Tilt, and Zoom” (PTZ) via the computer.

Most of you, at some point in the last several months, have noticed the current TV in our sanctuary that projects the PowerPoint for our online viewers. This set-up, as primitive as it may seem, is important for allowing our online worshippers to participate. They don’t have access to hymnals or bulletins, so without this, their singing and spoken responses are impossible—severely limiting their participation.

With this new project, everyone will be able to enjoy the same benefits of the PowerPoint!

### **WHAT DO I DO NOW THAT THERE ARE TVs IN THE SANCTUARY?**

- (1) Do not change the channel to watch the big game during the service.*
- (2) Do not throw objects at the screen because your team is losing. (see #1)*
- (3) Do not turn up the volume to drown out the pastor’s sermon. (see #1)*
- (4) Do not use the TV to watch “fake news.”*
- (5) Do not lose the remote control or blame your loved ones for losing it.*

Adding media in a church sanctuary is not about “getting with the times.” It isn’t about “going big and shiny.” It isn’t about becoming entertaining or making a spectacle of ourselves. It is not a desperate attempt to draw in younger people.

*It is about [accessibility](#). And it’s about being [environmentally-friendly](#).*

**Accessibility:** TVs are simply easier for the eyes. Our four 50-inch TVs will allow our lyrics and liturgy to be read with greater ease. I have helped install PowerPoint in every previous church I have served, and even those who may have resisted at first soon softened up once they realized that TVs are easier on older eyes. The words will, quite simply, be larger than is practical on any printed sheet. Additionally, our set up will make participating online easier as well, since the PowerPoint will be inserted directly into the live-stream via the computer. Right now, the iPhone is trying to focus on the front of the church AND a 32-inch TV in the foreground; so, we have occasional focusing issues and discoloration of the video.

**Eco-friendly:** We hope that this project will allow us to reduce the number of bulletins we need, or at the very least, reduce the number of inserts.

**Engagement:** Let us acknowledge that media can also enhance worship by keeping us more engaged. Pictures, videos clips, and scriptural quotes can help engage our hearts and minds to a greater degree. Now you can see the Bible Story as it is being read; you can reflect on the scripture references that are in the sermon; and the pictures can help bring alive what is being preached.

*So . . . what do you do now that there are TVs in the sanctuary?*

Continue to be the wonderful Christian people you are! Installing media in sanctuaries does not come without its controversies. Our media project will continue to respect the overall aesthetics of our worship space. We believe it

will not pose as a distraction or even block the view of worshippers.

*Let’s put our project into context:* The use of organs inside churches in the early 1800s did not come without controversy; organs were associated with the theater, not sacred worship! In the late 1800s, indoor plumbing threatened the integrity of the worshipping people—to think that we could actually use the bathroom *inside* the church building! Such a thought is disgraceful! *(Our next project at PEUMC is installing outhouses at every entrance of our facilities as part of our 125<sup>th</sup> “Blast to the Past” anniversary celebration!)* *[Please file any complaints with our office administrator!]* In the mid-1900s, amplification also brought complaints since it was considered new, and electronics had no place in the church. But then people realized that being able to hear might have its benefits.

Consider the technologies we have installed in our church since our sanctuary was first built: an electrical organ with speakers, a keyboard with speakers, a sound system with microphones and monitors. Adding media is simply another piece of our mission to make worship accessible and engaging—for deepening our experience with the Risen Christ, not to detract from it.

*Will we do away with the bulletins, Bibles, and hymnals?*

No, not unless you want to have a good old-fashioned book-burning ceremony this year. *Your call.*

We will continue to print our usual weekly bulletins (both in regular- and large-print) and we will retain our Bibles and hymnals.

*There are two more additional benefits to having TVs projecting the song lyrics:*

(1) Our singing will be stronger. We will no longer have our heads looking down at a hymnal but will have our heads turned upward toward a TV to sing. This naturally means our singing will be more robust.

(2) Admittedly, many will agree that seeing the music is very helpful to them. This is particularly true when we are learning a new song. Even if someone does not read music, they recognize how the notes move up or down. But, then again, do we really need to see the music when we are singing “Amazing Grace” or “How Great Thou Art”?

**Who can admit those times when our eyes are so distracted trying to understand the words and line up the right syllables with the right notes, that by the end of the song, we have no idea what we were singing about?**

**Consider these words from Charles Wesley’s hymn found on UMH 627:**

O the depth of love di -- vine,  
the un -- fath -- o -- ma -- ble grace!  
Let the wis -- est mor -- tals show  
how we the grace re -- ceive;

**Here’s how you’d be singing it on the TV screens:**

**O the depth of love divine,  
the unfathomable grace!**

**Let the wisest mortals show  
how we the grace receive;**



## ELEVATOR NEWS

Well, things are looking up. That’s what elevators do; they go up. The Elevator Study Group has been very active in January. The Study Group visited a local church to view their installation. Discussions were held with our architect, Revelation Architects of Stevens Point. As the result of these meetings, bids were solicited from two manufactures. It was a difficult decision as the bids were nearly alike. We have heard from some of you to make sure the elevator is large enough to accommodate motorized wheel chairs and the newly popular mobility scooters. The study Group chose OTIS Elevator to meet these needs.

The next steps are to finalize the elevator contract and complete the architectural drawings. Drawings then will be submitted for state approval. Construction is expected to begin early in the summer and be completed before the fall bazaar.

Make no mistake, this project is a major effort for our church. Costs will be in excess of \$300,000. We have received contributions and grants from our congregation and others to fund this project and recently a major grant came from the Alexander Family Charitable Foundation.

At the conclusion of the project we will have a thank-you dedication for the contributors. The project has been fully funded with grants and pledges.

We have collected 3 special offerings for the “CARING CLOSET,” a ministry overseen by Heath Lisitza, the elementary school counselor.

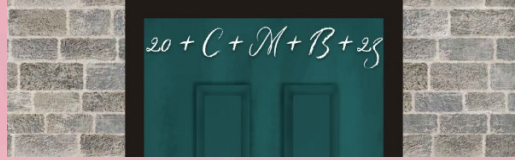

# Epiphany Chalk – a follow up



If you marked your doors at home with the Epiphany Chalk while using the House Blessing for this year, I want to remind you of your options for **removing** the chalk:

- (a) *leave it up all year, until next Epiphany (January 6<sup>th</sup>);*
- (b) *wipe it off on February 2<sup>nd</sup> – 40 days after Christmas; (sorry, this date has passed!)*
- (c) *wipe it off anytime between Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup> – Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> (the end of the Epiphanytide season and the beginning of Lent);*
- (d) *wipe it off whenever you remember to do it! 😊*

There is no real ritual or timing for removing the chalk inscription.

But these 4 options above give you the greatest latitude for doing it with some level of intention.

## INGATHERING 2023

Ingathering is an annual collection of items for Midwest Missions Distribution Center located in Chatham, Illinois. They are associated with the United Methodist Committee On Relief (UMCOR). MMDC provides *birthing kits, feminine hygiene kits, tornado kits, layette kits, student kits, personal dignity kits, home care kits, bed packs.*

They also make school desks out of old floorboards, refurbish old sewing machines, and repair old bikes. They distribute these kits and items around the world where the needs are the greatest.

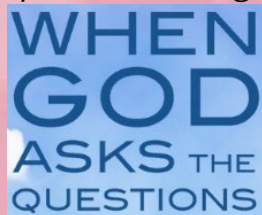

Here's the scoop on our VERY special speaker.

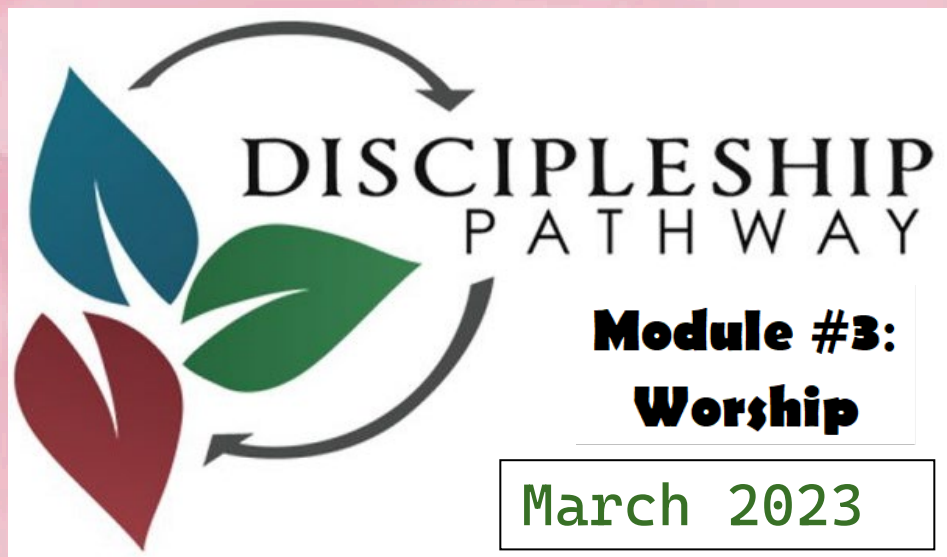

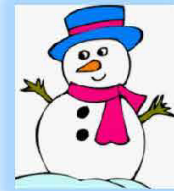


