PRAYER OF CONFESSION

ALL: Merciful God, when we hear the words from Jesus:

'Take up your cross and follow Me,' they scare us.

We know what it meant for Jesus.

We are unsure if we can sacrifice our lives, too.

We are not even ready on most days

to sacrifice those trivial things for the sake of Your Kin'dom. Forgive us for choosing daily to be smug, for all our made-up excuses, and for complaining about being bored as we do little worthwhile.

Forgive us for trying to make our cross more comfortable, for finding Your cross too harsh and inconvenient.

Forgive us for not loving our neighbor as You have loved us—
(we'd do it in a heartbeat, if only we first knew their names)!
So here we are, Lord: forgive us and free us!

Tonight, we choose again to take up our cross and follow You! In the name of Jesus, who lived with us, died by us, and rose for us: AMEN!

WORDS OF ASSURANCE:

L: Hear the Bad News:

Jesus died a prolonged, humiliating, gruesome death on a torture device used by the state as a strategic show of fear. *Hear the Good News of Jesus Christ:*

His love still speaks from this cross, overturning the power of evil! **ALL:** In His name, we are a forgiven people! Glory to God! AMEN!

*CONFESSIONAL HYMN: Where He Leads Me (vs. 1 & 3) UMH 338

Vs. 1: I can hear my Savior calling: (3x) "Take thy cross and—follow—follow Me."

Chorus: Where He leads me, I will follow: (3x) I'll go with Him—with Him—all the way.

Vs. 3: I'll go with Him through the judgment: (3x) I'll go with Him—with Him—all the way. (\underline{chorus})

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

(each time): L: O Crucified God, ALL: deliver us from evil!

- Vs. 1: O young and fearless Prophet of ancient Galilee, Thy life is still a summons to serve humanity; to make our thoughts and actions less prone to please the crowd, to stand with humble courage for truth with hearts uncowed.
