

Our Sunday School kids had a blast creating a Valentine's Day Card almost as big as they are! What a wonderful surprise for Pastor Caleb!



Easter Choir Practice




Calling all singers! We will be practicing the 2005 song "Everlasting God" for Easter Sunday.

Every year, each local United Methodist church is required to submit a statistical report to the denomination. Below are just some of the numbers given from PEUMC for the calendar year 2023. Naturally, some of the numbers requested are harder than others to determine with great accuracy, but we try our best to have them reflect reality.

** Question: How do we calculate these numbers?

Answer: There is no perfect way to calculate online attendance. We certainly keep track every time someone submits an online registration, and YouTube keeps track of the number of views each service receives. BUT one view does not necessarily equal one person. One view could be 2 or more people watching on the same device. One person could have watched the video multiple times or have logged on and off several times during the video; this causes a new view to be counted each time. And is it really fair to count the views that a video receives three months later? Is that really 'attending' the service? So, in 2024, we are going to keep track of the number of YouTube views that take place while the service is live and those in the first 30 days of being posted online. This number will be multiplied by the average older household in Wisconsin (1.8).

- All money collected will be given directly to The Family Center and will not be allocated to purchase "Sendoff" items.

Use the order form (on the back of this page). If you choose to do a dedication, please fill out the "In Honor of" and "In Memory Of" lines.


There will be inserts in the Sunday bulletin beginning March 3. You can purchase one or more plants and return the form and your payment to the church office by Sunday March 17.

GOOD FRIDAY A SHORT, SOLEMN OBSERVANCE



2:45 – 3:00 PM – FRIDAY, MARCH 29TH (sanctuary)

Biblical accounts state that Jesus died around 3 o'clock in the afternoon. We will not be hosting a full-length service for Good Friday but hosting a simple gathering for a quick observance at the cross.

We'll gather in the sanctuary at 2:45 PM for a solemn moment of reflection and liturgy

Stations of the Cross - Self-Guided, Come-and-Go Devotions PEUMC Fellowship Hall

Monday through Friday – last two weeks of March
Morning 9:00 am – 1:00 pm / Evenings 4:00 pm – 8:00 pm

Stations of the Cross (also known as 'Way of the Cross' or 'Via Crucis,' Way of Sorrows) refers to a series of images depicting the events in the life of Jesus Christ on the day of His death. Each image, or station, is accompanied by reflections and devotions. The original Stations of the Cross come from the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem the traditional route Jesus took carrying His cross through streets of City of David.

Our Stations of the Cross will be prayer stations placed around

the perimeter of our Fellowship Hall. It will be self-guided. For two weeks (10 days, 4 hours in the morning, 4 hours in the evening), the Fellowship Hall will remain open for you to stop by and pray your way through the Good Friday events. There will be approximately 12 stations.
