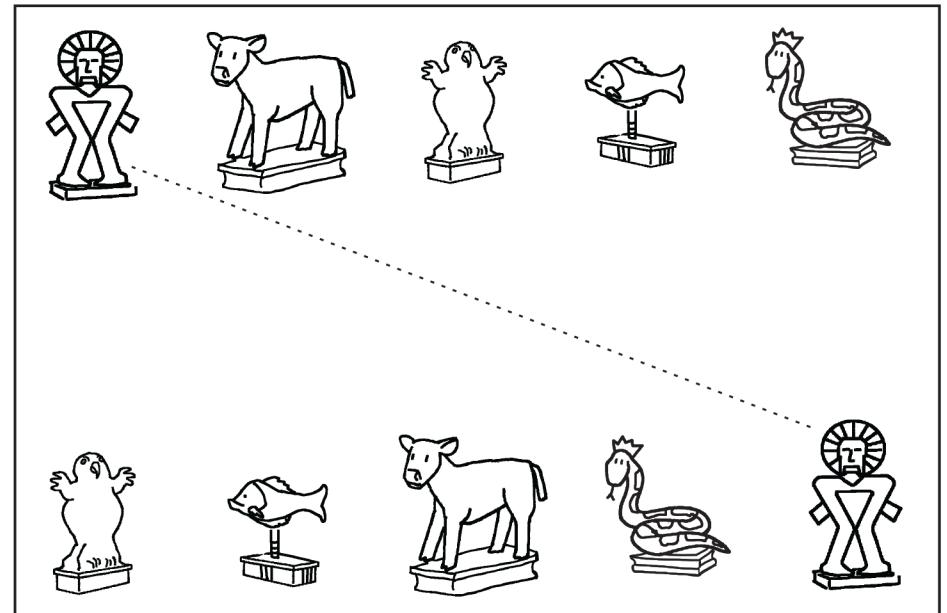


## Paul at Athens, Part 1

Circle the crosses  hidden in the picture.

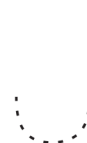
